Good Sportsmanship Guidelines

To ensure a fun, fair, and respectful environment for everyone, please follow these sportsmanship standards during league play:

General Conduct

- Treat all players with courtesy and respect at all times.
- Introduce yourself to new players before matches.
- Refrain from using foul language or inappropriate gestures.
- After each game, meet your opponents at the net to acknowledge the match with a friendly gesture or comment.
- Familiarize yourself with the official rules of pickleball.

Line Calls

- Respect your opponents' line calls on their side of the court.
- If you see your own shot land out, call it out.
- If you're unsure about a line call on your side, defer to your opponents and accept their decision.
- Only call a ball "out" if you clearly see it out.
- If questioning an opponent's call, do so calmly and respectfully—never argue.
- In situations of uncertainty, give the benefit of the doubt to your opponents.

Foot Faults

- Monitor your own and your partner's foot position, especially at the service line and the Non-Volley Zone (Kitchen).
- Call foot faults immediately and honestly.

Court Courtesy

- If others are waiting to play, please vacate the court promptly after each game.
- Only cross behind active courts when play has paused.

Stray Balls

- If a ball from your court rolls onto another, clearly warn the players on that court.
- Stop play immediately for stray balls that enter your court.

Partner Etiquette

- Always be respectful and supportive of your partner.
- Avoid negative verbal or non-verbal reactions during play. Constructive communication is encouraged.
